

In this Sunday's Gospel, we reflect on the story of Jesus calling the fishermen to cast their nets down and become fisher of men. Sounds simple enough - but is it? An article I read gave us some insight into the task in which we have been called as Intentional Disciples. Below are the highlights of that article and a link of where it can be found.

What Does It Mean to Be Fishers of Men?

The idea behind fishing is to know the fish you are looking for and attract it so you can make the catch. To catch a fish we must know what equipment to use, the habitat and depth of the water we are fishing in, as well as the kind of bait the fish will go after. After we understand everything we need for real fishing, then how do we relate that to being fishers of men?

God asks us to make disciples of all nations (<u>Matthew 28:18–20</u>). Just as we need equipment to be fishermen, we need equipment to be fishers of men. Putting on the armor of God is one way to be ready at all times with everything we need (<u>Ephesians 6:10–18</u>). Especially important are the shield of faith and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God. Without these two pieces of spiritual equipment, we will find fishing for men's souls impossible.

Not only must we have the armor of God as our equipment, but we must also know the fish we are trying to catch. God uses his glorious gospel to shine light into the darkness around those seeking him, and sometimes He uses us to do it. He knows which "fish" are His; therefore, we are to seek His wisdom and His guidance on all our fishing expeditions. How do we do this? Prayer is essential.

As we know the gospel message has the power to change lives and shine light into darkness. There is power in no other message and no other "net" can catch the fish of God. This was Jesus' message to Peter and Andrew—follow Me, learn of Me, know and understand My mission and My message. Only then will you be able to be fishers of men.
